The next trip to Saint Sébastien

The arrangements for our next trip to Saint Sébastien are now taking shape. This year we are planning to visit in the last week of August.

Departure will be on the morning of the bank holiday, i.e. **Monday 25th August**, with our return on the evening of **Saturday 31st August**. We will therefore have 5 nights and 4 full days in Saint Sébastien. The journey will be by ferry from Portsmouth to Cherbourg, so there won't be a repeat of 2000's long journey. The cost will be **£100** per person although, as on previous trips, we hope to be able to offer a substantial refund on the basis of grant aid from the European Union.

If you've already been to Saint Sébastien you will want to renew old acquaintances and have another great time. If you haven't been already, come along to discover what the rest of us are so enthusiastic about.

The Rules of Boule (Pétanque)

Some members of the Association, led by Georges Michaud, are planning to arrange boules matches on the site of the now demolished Dunraven Court flats. At last the site is being put to a good use! Since some of us have whiled away some hot hours tossing boules without really knowing the correct rules, we asked Georges to help.

The game is played by two teams of one, two or three players. In a team of 2 players each member uses 3 "boules". In a team of 3 players, each member uses 2 "boules". There must not be more than 12 boules on the ground. The first team is chosen by tossing a coin. Any player in this team chooses a starting place and draws a circle on the ground in which to stand. This should be between 1ft 2ins and 1ft 8ins. The player throws the jack ("but") between 6yds and 10yds away and it must not be any nearer than 1yd from any (I've added the following bit -NS) obstacle. The teams then take it in turns to throw a boule as close as possible to the jack. Once a lead is established the other side must throw until they regain the lead or run out of boules. Once all boules have been thrown the score is recorded. The team closest to the jack wins one point. Extra points are won for any other boules which are closer to the jack than the opposition team's nearest boule. The winner then restarts the game, and it continues until one team has 13 points. A match consists of 3 games.

Or if you prefer...

Ce jeu se joue 1 contre 1, soit en 2 équipes de 2 ou 3 joueurs. Tête à tête avec 3 boules chacun. Doublette (2 contre 2) avec 3 boules. Triplette 3 contre 3 avec 2 boules chacun. Il ne doit pas y avoir plus de 12 boules sur le terrain. On tire au sort l'équipe qui commence à jouer. N'importe quel jouer de cette équipe choisit le point de départ, et trace sur le sol un cercle de 36 à 50 cm. Quand il joue il ne doit pas sortir du cercle. Ce joueur lance alors le "but" à une distance de 6 à 10 mètres. Le "but" doit être au moins à 1 mètre de tout
